The Sandwell Young Adult Diabetes Clinic is for young adults aged 16-18 who have diabetes. The clinic has been set up to help you prepare to transfer to adult diabetes services, and for life as an adult with diabetes. We hope that by the time we transfer your care to the adult diabetes team, you will feel confident in your ability to manage your diabetes.

Who is the clinic run by?

Where is the clinic held?

The clinic is held in the Diabetes Centre at Sandwell General Hospital. This is where the adult diabetes clinics are held so gives you the chance to become familiar with the environment where you will be seen when you transfer to adult diabetes care. You will also get to meet the adult diabetes team here informally.

When is the clinic held?

The clinic usually takes place on the second Monday of the month between 2pm and 5pm. You will be sent an appointment to attend the clinic each time.
