

# Advice following gastroscopy with local anaesthetic throat spray

Information and advice for patients

## ***Endoscopy***

You have had a gastroscopy with a local anaesthetic throat spray that contained medication called lidocaine to numb your throat.

## **Pain**

You may experience a sore throat for the next 12 - 24 hours. You may also experience some mild tummy pain. You can take simple painkillers such as paracetamol for this if you think you need it. Follow the dosage instructions on the packet.

## **Eating and drinking**

As you have had lidocaine to numb your throat, you may not be able to swallow safely for a short time after the procedure.

**Therefore do not eat or drink for 1 hour after the procedure.**

The nurse will tell you when you can have a cold drink. You can have a cold drink at \_\_\_\_\_. This will stimulate your swallowing reflex. After this you will be able to drink hot drinks and eat as normal.

## **Normal activities**

You should be able to resume all of your normal activities straight away as long as you feel able to. This includes driving and going back to work.

## **Results**

We will send a copy of your gastroscopy report to the doctor or nurse who referred you for the procedure.

We will also send a copy of this to your GP.

Please contact us if you experience any of the following symptoms after this procedure:

- Breathing problems
