What is the Community Parkinson's Nurse Service?

The Community Parkinson's Nurse Service is a specialist nurse service for people with Parkinson's disease, and their carers and families. The aim of the service is to enhance the quality of life of people with Parkinson's disease by providing support, education and advice.

What can my Parkinson's nurse help with?

You should contact your Parkinson's nurse if:

- you have questions about your medication or your medication has changed
- your symptoms change
- you are coughing when eating or drinking
- you are becoming confused or having hallucinations
- there are changes in your behaviour or mood
- you are having falls
- you are struggling with daily tasks.

How can I contact my Parkinson's nurse?

You can contact your Parkinson's nurse on Tel: 0121 507 2664 option 5 Monday - Friday, 8.30am - 4.30pm.

This number is a message-taking service. You may be asked some questions by the member of staff answering the telephone so that we can deal with your call more efficiently.

Telephone messages will be returned by the Parkinson's Nurse during their next telephone clinic and may not be the same working day, so if the call is URGENT please inform the person you speak to.

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If you wish to make an appointment with the Parkinson's Nurse for a non-urgent review please leave a message and an appointment will be sent out to you. Appointments are usually held in a local clinic, unless you are unable to access one in which case the nurse may visit your home. Your nurse will tell you where your local clinic is.
