The new actions were discussed; the final plan will be presented to the June Board.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Quality Plan         <ul> <li>Work will continue on the mortality agenda but the Quality Plan will now begin to focus on the other nine topics aimed at improving outcomes of care. These will all progress forward but at different pace and linking in with other existing projects/work.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Safety Plan         <ul> <li>The refresh of the Safety Plan is taking place. A recent internal audit review had reported a reasonable assurance finding.
