



The Place Based Partnerships have substantial plans over the next 9 months not only to build on the number of patients having access it this new service combined with a realignment of the teams to support delivery. Of patients seen by this team, 86% remain in their own home, 4% are stepped up into a community bed and 10% require hospital admission	Pration Officer

Whilst the amount of activity delivered in this area continues to show strong performance the main area of focus is in two key areas, increasing the volume of UCR2 as noted above and bringing the Care Navigation Centre online to start to address the increased urgent care activity. ### Covid – Virtual Ward Referrals

Activity in this area remains variable based on the prevalence of Covid 19 in the community and the virtual support required.

The Trust has now submitted the plans for the 164 virtual ward beds across both Sandwell and Ladywood and Perry Barr and these services will come online in a phase manner over the next 9 months. This standard only looks at one domain of this activity and will now be recommended for removal and replaced with a total Virtual ward measure.



As discussed in last months board, these measures were designed to be transitional as the new programmes of work come online in the Place Based Partnerships. The measures don't reflect the scope of work or improvements that are underway.

The population measures are being realigned to the areas of focus and to fit with the wider board level metrics. At the time of writing a revised proposal was being consider by the Executive and subject to agreement the Board will be updated with a timeline for publication.
