In my previous reports I have broken down the current work on the population metrics in the format below and for the medium term I will retain this format whilst the Integration Committee matures, and the system establishes a set of agreed measures.

#### Long term strategic outcome measures

I reported last month that we would be seeking clarity from the other Places in the Black Country and West Birmingham on alignment of the core set of long-term measures. These have now been obtained and together with the ones previously agreed will be built into a full set with the support of the Director of Public Health and links to the local Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JNSA) with the planning schedule restarting in March.

This work is still on track for a first draft at the April Integration committee and will be reported at infrequent intervals as advised by the Director of Public Health.

The work for alignment on **output measures** has also recommenced after the delays reported due to Covid 19.

Walsall have a full set of measures with additional items being created for virtual wards which are being reviewed for consistency with Sandwell and have also been shared with Birmingham Community Healthcare for the West Birmingham Place. There is a broad commitment to align the work and develop these together. The other Places in the Black Country have less developed measures and therefore the Trusts role becomes one of support to assist the wider development.

The new national standards of urgent care community 2 hour response, virtual wards, discharge to assess and length of stay measures will all be mapped into this area together with the information about the six Sandwell Towns. The former will be critically important as the Ambulance Service seeks to re design the way that Category 3 calls (Non-life threatening) are cascaded down to places in preference to an ambulance response.

The **transformation measures** will be reported to the Integration committee as previously advised in March. These will focus on the current major projects and will move into the output measures once each project matures. They will be mapped in this manner so that the Place Based Partnership and Integration Committee can seek assurance on progress and associated benefits as the transformation plan develops.
