#### **Community Engagement Update** Chair's opinion: Substantial MMUH roadshow and community bus tours going well **Assurance** Over 150 locations covered Good engagement from near neighbours events with support from Sandwell and Birmingham city council representatives Next quarter there will be a focus on maternity services **Integration Metrics** Chair's opinion: Reasonable • The planned reduction in acute care beds and occupancy is off track for delivery. Assurance Admissions avoidance schemes and urgent community response contacts consistently exceeding targets Average LOS currently 5.1, previously 4.1 days. **Ladywood and Perry Barr Partnership** Chair's opinion: Reasonable Locality board currently re-evaluating the operating model. BSOL ICB have appointed BCHCFT to lead the associated Community Care Collaborative, which is the Assurance Vehicle being used for driving forward integrated care. Secured £1.4m in Fairer Futures funding. Working with partners including the voluntary sector to agree a strategy to use the funds to tackle inequalities in 5 key areas Locality hub team started with partners. The virtual teams in-reaches into City hospital to support discharge and admission avoidance. The team also works with West Midlands Ambulance Service to provide interventions at home to avoid hospital conveyance. Good results already being reported **Sandwell Health and Care Partnership** Chair's opinion: Substantial Integrated Discharge Hub has been used as an area for learning for other systems **Assurance** UCR continues to outperform the Trust Annual Plan target and national response targets with month on month Increased number of contacts Falls response service is achieving demonstrable reductions in acute hospital bed days. The combination of the Care Navigation Centre (CNC) and Single Point of Access (SPA) continues to deliver higher numbers of contacts and avoided ED attendances than neighbouring Places Pathway 1 discharge performance deteriorated **GP Acquisition Update** Chair's opinion: **Substantial** Assurance Committee noted and supported the bid for the Trust to supply APMS services from Susmmerfield Group practice **MMUH Rightsizing** Chair's opinion: Partial • The committee was present with the best, likely and worst-case scenario for MMUH bed fit and rightsizing for winter 24/25. They are planning for the likely case and Assurance working toward the best-case scenario. This will be monitored monthly and necessary adjustment made on each scenario.
