COMMUNITY GARDEN & ART GALLERY OPENS AT THE NEW HOSPITAL

On 8 April High Sheriff West Midlands, Doug Wright and Chair of Your City and Metropolitan Hospitals Charity, Steve Allen officially opened Midland Met's two new exciting community spaces:

The new Midland Metropolitan Hospital opened in autumn 2024

The Commons: the hospital's very own community garden, designed and built by, neurodiverse arts company, Spectra with and for local people. It features an array of creative installations, resting places, biodiversity and sensory-enriching planting dotted throughout, all designed to promote well-being by encouraging people to rest, reflect, chat and make new connections.

The People's Gallery: a unique adaptable gallery, spanning the length of the Winter Gardens. The opening exhibition features artworks by patients, staff and local residents working with local arts organisations and artists including: photographs celebrating City Road Hospital and Sandwell General Hospital by artist Tom Hicks, MMUH Near Neighbours group and staff; a large textile artwork designed and crafted by migrant mothers with Mothership, which reflects on discussions around accessing Sandwell's maternity services, and artworks created by patients and people from the local community with arts organisation Spectra.

NHS CHARITY REVEALS NEW NAME

The name for the newly created independent charity for Sandwell and West Birmingham NHS Trust has been unveiled as Your City and Metropolitan Hospitals Charity.

The charity will continue to support the Midland Metropolitan University Hospital, the UK's newest healthcare facility, and the Trust's other sites – Sandwell, City and Rowley Regis Hospitals as well as GP practices and community services.



Your City & Metropolitan Hospitals Charity is also celebrating the successful closure of the £2 million 'We Are Metropolitan' fundraising campaign for the Midland Met, opening on 6 October.

Johnny Shah, Head of Your City & Metropolitan Hospitals Charity, added: "Becoming an independent

charity for the Trust means we can do even more to enhance the experience of everyone using our hospitals and healthcare services. The work we have funded at Midland Met are great examples of this, but it is important to remember that both Sandwell and Birmingham remain within the top 10 most deprived local authorities in the country.

The new name was revealed at an official launch event held in Birmingham City Centre on 3 October.





SPORTY NHS TEAM GET MOVING FOR CHARITY

The team of 18, who included trainees, consultants, managers, occupational therapists, and a specialist asthma nurse took on the Stratford Sprint Triathlon and raised nearly £2,000 for equipment that will be used by patients.

Leading the charge, was consultant Dr Maria Atkinson. She said: "I think we all found the course tough but all enjoyed the experience and team spirit.

Sandwell and West Birmingham NHS Trust runs the Midland Metropolitan University Hospital, in Smethwick, where inpatient wards for children are based. Outpatient appointments for youngsters take place at Sandwell and City Health Campuses. The money raised, £1.835, will be used across the different areas.

The team began a programme of training for the event four months ago and carved up some of the activities between them, whilst others took on the entire challenge.
