Engagement round up 2023

Coffee & Catch Up

Engage members were invited to a coffee and catch up session on Tuesday 12th March 2024 and over 30 people attended. At the session, updates and discussions took place about Midland Metropolitan University Hospital, volunteering opportunities, and how to improve patient safety and patient experiences. Additionally, there was a focus on apprenticeships tailored for both young



individuals and adults, with the aim of providing valuable opportunities to develop skills and careers within the Trust.

Decision from stroke conversation

As part of ongoing conversations, we conducted a survey about the changes to stroke services between December 2023 January 2024. It was completed by over 90 patients and local people who provided feedback on the new hospital and the colocation of stroke rehabilitation services from Sandwell Hospital to Rowley Regis Hospital. We also held a feedback session on 21st March to share the feedback from the survey and other conversations. The Trust has asked the Joint Health Overview



and Scrutiny Committees for Sandwell and Birmingham to endorse the decision

to co-locate Stroke inpatient rehabilitation to Rowley Hospital alongside other rehabilitation and therapy services.

Involvement and insight strategy

Our aim is to co-produce an Involvement and Insight Strategy 2024/25 for the Trust. It will set out how we engage with the people that use our services and how we will work together. The strategy will aim to ensure that what we hear, influences the quality of what services we provide and also helps to improve patient experiences. This will also help us to



develop better ways for people to engage and talk with us.

As part of this initiative, we would like to set up a Patient Public Voice (PPV), aligned to the work around patient experience. We will be recruiting members who represent our population and will share details on how to express your interest soon.

West Birmingham Primary and Secondary Care Engagement

The second GP engagement was held in February for our West Birmingham primary and secondary care colleagues. The aim of the event was to strengthen relationships with general practice and improve patient flows before Midland Met opens in October. Discussions took place around health and social issues in West



Birmingham, care models, how to improve patient flow and pathways, and how, as a Trust, we can play our part to support patient access to general practice. A further joint event will be held to share findings and work together to improve pathways.

Stained glass windows restoration

We're working with a local stained-glass artist, our Chaplain Eddie, Mortuary Manager Lauren, and Arts Manager Amy, to explore the potential of refurbishing and repurposing the exquisite stained glass







windows gracing the Chapel of Rest at City hospital. We'll keep you updated on developments!

Volunteering

The volunteers team has been busy recruiting members to support both the Trust and our new Midland Met hospital. They have held five successful volunteer recruitment days, attended by over 125 people.

Some of our volunteers supporting the move to Midland Met had their first 'Deep Dive' training session with the managers of some of the departments they will be working with. These include Emergency, Chaplaincy, Catering, Outpatients and Your Trust Charity. At the session, volunteers were placed in small groups and given first-hand insight into what life is



like behind the scenes. They also had the opportunity to ask questions and learn more about the tasks they will be doing when we move into the new hospital.

The SCORE (Supporting Career Opportunities, Recruitment & Employment) programme offers volunteers a unique work experience to gain employment. And recently, a former participant in the SCORE program, secured a position as a Health Care Assistant working through our Trust Bank.

The Trust also offers our volunteers 'Monthly Connections' sessions, to meet other volunteers, mingle and catch up. And, looking ahead, the volunteer team is excited to commemorate Volunteers Week in early June with events at both Sandwell and City Hospitals. For more information about volunteering click here.

The bus will also be visiting Sandwell and City hospitals more regularly to inform our patients and local people

Upcoming changes to services

Once Midland Met opens in October, all emergency and acute services from City Hospital and Sandwell General Hospital will be moving to the new hospital. Our emergency departments will be



merging and relocating there, as well our inpatient wards, childrens departments, maternity services and the regional Sickle Cell and Thalassaemia centre.

City Hospital will be redeveloped, and Homes England will build new homes on the site. Despite the changes, Birmingham and Midland Eye Centre, the Birmingham Treatment Centre, the Skin Centre, outpatient services, diagnostics, day surgery, and a pharmacy hub will stay on the City site.

Sandwell Hospital will become Sandwell Treatment Centre and continue to provide GP-led urgent (but not emergency) care and offer services such as the Sandwell Urgent Treatment Centre, primary care GP services, outpatient services, diagnostics, day surgery and treatment, children's outpatient care, an education centre, a clinical research facility, and a pharmacy.
